A new Article 11 in Chapter 5 of the Revised Ordinances of 9 Albuquerque is hereby adopted as follows: 10 § 5-11-1 SHORT TITLE - Deletion 11 This ordinance may be cited as "The Apprenticeship Empowerment Bracketed/Underscored Material] - New 12 Ordinance." 13 § 5-11-2 DEFINITIONS Bracketed/Strikethrough Material] 14 For purposes of this ordinance the following terms have the following 15 definitions: 16 APPRENTICE. Means an individual enrolled in an apprenticeship program 17 that is registered pursuant to the Apprenticeship Assistance Act, NMSA 1978, 18 Chapter 21, Article 19A, or registered with the U.S. Department of Labor's 19 Office of Apprenticeship. 20 APPRENTICE UTILIZATION REQUIRMENT. Means that a minimum of 15% 21 of total labor hours within each trade with apprentices for which there is an 22 official apprenticeship training program must be performed by apprentices of 23 that trade on an applicable public construction project. 24 CONTRACTOR. An individual or entity engaged in the business of 25 constructing, altering, repairing, or improving any public construction project. 26 The contractor is responsible for the overall coordination and completion of

1	the project and is required to comply with the apprenticeship utilization
2	requirement and responsible contractor qualifications as set forth in this
3	ordinance. The contractor may employ subcontractors to perform portions of
4	the work but retains overall responsibility for compliance with the ordinance
5	provisions.
6	LABOR HOURS. Means the total hours of workers receiving an hourly wage
7	who are directly employed on the site of the public construction project.
8	"Labor hours" includes hours performed by workers employed by the
9	contractor and all subcontractors working on the public construction project.
10	"Labor hours" does not include hours worked by superintendents and 8
11	owners.
12	SPONSORING BODY. Any employer, association, committee, or
13	organization that operates a Registered Apprenticeship Program. This entity
14	assumes full responsibility for administration and operation of an Official
15	Apprenticeship Training Program. Sponsors can be compromised of a single
16	business or multiple businesses. Alternatively, the sponsor can be a
17	workforce intermediary, such as an industry association or a labor-
18	management organization. Community colleges and community-based
19	organizations can also serve as sponsors of apprenticeship programs.
20	OFFICIAL APPRENTICESHIP TRAINING PROGRAM. Means an
21	apprenticeship training program registered pursuant to the Apprenticeship
22	Assistance Act, NMSA 1978, Chapter 21, Article 19A, or registered with the
23	U.S. Department of Labor's Office of Apprenticeship.
24	PUBLIC CONSTRUCTION PROJECT. Means any City of Albuquerque
25	project subject to the provisions of ROA 1994, Section 5-5-11 in which a single
26	project construction cost is estimated to cost \$1,000,000 or more, the project
27	is publicly bid through a Request for Bids, and where the City is the project
28	owner.
29	§ 5-11-3 APPRENTICESHIP REQUIREMENT
30	(A) Unless such a requirement conflicts with State or Federal law, all

(A) Unless such a requirement conflicts with State or Federal law, all contractors performing work on any public construction project shall commit to the apprenticeship utilization requirement. During the course of construction, the number of hours may vary, but 15% of the total hours on the

this ordinance.

- actual construction job site must be performed by registered apprentices in each trade in which there is an official apprenticeship training program. This shall apply only to occupations with apprentices involved in the proposed construction for which there is an official apprenticeship training program. Work cannot be divided among contractors or subcontractors at any tier to evade the apprenticeship utilization requirements. Where two or more contractors or subcontractors perform work within a trade, each contractor or subcontractor shall comply with the apprenticeship utilization requirements of
 - (B) All contractors and subcontractors subject to this ordinance must provide verified payroll reports on at least a monthly basis to the City Purchasing Office, certifying the names of all workers performing labor hours, their trade, hours worked, and designation as journey level worker or apprentice.
 - (C) The contractor may submit documentation affirming that there are not available apprentices in a particular trade to meet the 15% requirement of §5-11-3(A). Such documentation must be signed by all sponsoring bodies of that particular trade. Upon receipt of such documentation, the requirements in §5-11-3(A) shall be waived for that particular trade.

§ 5-11-4 BIDDING PREFERENCE APPLICABILITY

The City of Albuquerque shall award a 10% bidding preference for bidders that:

- (A) Upon submission of the bid, the contractor shall submit documentation affirming there are available apprentices in a particular trade to meet the 25% requirement of §5-11-4(B). Such documentation must be signed by all sponsoring bodies of that particular trade; and
- (B) Provide evidence of their ability to contractually commit to an apprentice utilization requirement stating at least 25% of all labor hours on the construction project site will be comprised of registered apprentices in each trade who are registered with an official apprenticeship training program; and
- (C) Provide the estimated total number of public construction project labor hours and the total number of apprenticeship labor hours for the project. The lowest responsible total bid, taking the preference into consideration, shall be

awarded the contract unless the solicitation provides for additional award criteria or exceptions to this ordinance. The contract amount awarded shall be the amount of the bid submitted, exclusive of the bidding preference.

During the course of construction, the number of hours may vary from the hours submitted in the bid, but 25% of the total hours on the actual public construction project must be performed by registered apprentices.

§ 5-11-5 RESPONSIBLE CONTRACTOR

The City shall ensure that all contractors and subcontractors at any tier subject to this ordinance will comply with the following qualifications and conditions at all times during their performance of work on any public construction project:

- (A) The contractor has not been debarred or suspended from performing construction work by any federal, state or local government agency or authority in the past five years;
- (B) The contractor must properly classify all employees as employee rather than independent contractors and treat them accordingly for purposes of minimum wages and overtime, worker's compensation insurance coverage, unemployment taxes, social security taxes and state and federal income tax withholding.

§ 5-11-6 PENALTY

(A) Failure to comply with the apprentice utilization requirement and/or responsible contractor conditions is evidence bearing on a contractor's qualification for award of future contract and may result in up to a one (1) year construction bidding suspension on a public construction project.

SECTION 2. SEVERABILITY. If any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, word or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unenforceable by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions of this Ordinance. The Council hereby declares that it would have passed this Ordinance and each section, paragraph, sentence, clause, word or phrase thereof irrespective of any provision being declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid.

SECTION 3. COMPILATION. SECTION 1 of this Ordinance is to be complied as a new Article 11 in Chapter 5 of the Revised Ordinances of

Albuquerque, New Mexico, 1994, titled "The Apprenticeship Empowerment
Ordinance."
SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall take effect on July 1
2025 after publication by title and general summary.
